

# Example Nursery Itinerary

## Animals of Aigas

**Aim:** To learn about the wild animals of Scotland.

Session	Timings	Content
Arrival & Introductions	10.00 – 10.15	Arrive at the Magnus house, meet the Education Team and explore the taxidermy on display. There will be time for a snack if required.
Animal Safari	10.15 – 11.00	Take a guided walk through the forest to look for the wild animals that live here. Children will hunt for clues about the animals we are looking to find, they will also get to see and feel some skulls and taxidermy animals.
Bug Hunt	11.00 – 11.30	Search for painted stone bugs that have been hidden, counting how many we find. Then hunt for real minibeasts on the forest floor, looking at how many legs they each have. We will use the animals we observe as inspiration for environmental art.
Creative Crafts	11.30 – 11.55	Get the creative juices flowing and build a colourful feeder for butterflies or a home for bugs.
Finish	11.55 – 12.00	Finish up and say our goodbyes.
Lunch	12.00 – 13.00	Groups are welcome to stay for lunch in the Magnus House, under parental supervision. The cost for this is £1 per child.
